Congratulations to Randy Kusano, a long-time high school and university coach in Manitoba; he has been named as a new member of the Manitoba Basketball Hall of Fame. Randy was a 5-6 back-up guard on the UM Bisons National Championship Team of 1975-76.

He went on to a long teaching and coaching career at several Winnipeg area schools, and also volunteered as an assistant coach for both the U. Manitoba Bisons Men's and Women's programs.
