Recruiting the World

UFV Cascades new coach, *Joe Enevoldson*, last week announced the signing of import recruit, *Dario Lopez*, a 6-7 fwd from Madrid, Spain. Lopez is yet another of the growing number of international signings by U-Sports teams. 'Back in the Day' universities had rosters almost exclusively made up of hometown or home region stand-outs.





We used to think of guys from B.C., Ontario, Quebec, or the Maritimes as 'imports'. But in the 2020s many Canadian schools are literally 'recruiting the world'. At UC, the Dinos will welcome 1st year imports, *Javier Reyes-Izquierdo (photo left)*, another 6-7 Spaniard, along with 6-11 forward *Aingar William* from the town of N'Djamena, in Chad, Africa.

Lethbridge adds *Alec Hillman* from Brisbane, Australia, while MacEwan has another Spaniard, *Eric Carretero*, a 6-3 guard from Gran Caneria, and UBC signed 6-5 fwd, *Brandon Nii-Yemoh Laryea*, who hails from Crawley, England. Elsewhere in the East, *Coach Matt Skinn* at Cape Breton welcomes *Kujtim Ujkani*, 6-5 fwd from Kosovo, while U. Toronto signed *Lenny Weber*, a 6-8

native of Wiesbaden, Germany, and Waterloo Warriors added *Noah Krauskopf*, a 6-4 guard who hails from Perth in Western Australia.

The combination of a high quality Canadian university education, 5 years eligibility, and possible athletic and/ or academic scholarships has made U-Sports a more compelling target for overseas players. Import players (with a maximum of 3 on any active playing team roster) are becoming far more common. We will take a look at the latest rosters in each U-Sports League -
